Abstract:

A unique assemblage of oral, written and pictorial social history of the Eurimbla Precinct and surrounding areas of Randwick, NSW, Australia. This book is an initiative of the Eurimbla Precinct Historical Association, Inc to record and commemorate the long history of this area, its community and events from 1851 to 2018. This small leafy suburban community of approximately 90 houses nestled between the Prince of Wales Hospital and the University of New South Wales was demolished in 2018-2019. Acquired by the NSW Government to make way for the expansion of the adjacent Hospital, this Randwick community and their homes have now disappeared. *Remembering Eurimbla* presents the fascinating early history of this historically significant area of Randwick together with many interesting stories, anecdotes, mysteries and surprises as well as memoirs and photographs from those who lived in the area.
